We can only honor requests that are made on or before September 3th to Dr. White or Mrs. Tietjen in the front office.**

FISH Program - The start of another school year brings us many opportunities to volunteer for the school. You can apply those hours towards your Family Involvement and Service Hours (FISH).

As a reminder, the Volunteer FISH Program provides opportunities for parents to work together to build a strong community spirit at St. Joseph Catholic School. **All 6th through 12th grade parents are required to complete 20 hours of service to the school.** If you have multiple children, you are required to complete the older child's service requirement. It is important to us to have all our families involved with service along with the opportunity to help us to build our community into one of constant service for others. If your family chooses not to provide fish hours, you will be charged \$12.50 per hour. All hours are due on or before the end of the school year. Students of parents/families not fulfilling their FISH requirements (hours or payment) by that time will not receive their school transcript for the 2017/2018 year.

To submit your hours, email fish@stjosephbcs.org, and in the body of the email please include a concise description along with the number of hours volunteered.

Remember, in order for hours to be applied towards your balance, the hours must be used in service of St. Joseph Catholic School.

REMINDERS:

Lunch Program – Lunch must be ordered on Renweb by Sunday(midnight) for the upcoming week. The menu on Renweb, will detail what items can be ordered each day. Please understand that we **CANNOT** provide a lunch for a student that was not ordered by Sunday(midnight) before the upcoming week.

Payments for lunch – You can pay for lunches by check or cash with the front office. If you wish to pay by credit card, go to our school website at www.stjosephschoolbcs.org, click on the PARENTS tab, and then click on PAYMENTS. Follow the directions provided carefully. Please keep in mind there is a fixed convenience fee for each credit card transaction. Each family has one account for all family members, so one payment takes care of multiple students.

Preparing for Partial Solar Eclipse Experience

Greetings,

As you know, a partial solar eclipse will take place on Monday, August 21st throughout the state of Texas, beginning around 11:41AM and will peak around 1:10PM. This is an incredible learning opportunity in which St. Joseph Catholic School is preparing our students for an educational, fulfilling and safe experience.

Risk Factor:

The only safe way to look at an uneclipsed or partially eclipsed sun is by using solar glasses or hand-held solar viewer. Eyewear must be dark enough so light can't pass through; if not, you can damage your eyes. According to NASA, "if you stare at the partially eclipsed sun for a length of time, even up to 20-30 seconds, you could definitely burn your retina leaving a blind spot that can't be corrected."

School Participation and Safety Precautions:

To ensure the safety of the students and a fulfilling experience, the school will conduct the following activities which are aligned with NASA's safety recommendations:

- Elementary students will watch a live broadcast in the classrooms. Teachers will provide information and engage in conversations about uneclipsed or partially eclipsed sun. We feel that it is in the best interest of the students' safety to keep them indoors during 11:41AM and 2PM, so that they are not tempted to look directly at the partially eclipsed sun.
- We will have several administrators and teachers guiding the students when they pass through the courtyard on their way to lunch, to ensure the students move quickly and efficiently limiting the temptation to look directly at the sun. Students will not be allowed to sit outside during lunch on this day.
- Junior and High School students will watch a live broadcast in the classrooms. More in-depth lessons and conversations will be conducted by the science teachers during class. During 5th and 6th periods, the junior high and high school students will be allowed to conduct several controlled and heavily monitored experiments to study the partially eclipsed sun that will not involve looking directly at the sun. **At this time, junior and high school students will have the opportunity to look at the partially eclipsed sun by only wearing approved solar glasses under the direct supervision of Mrs. Barry and Mrs. Rayburn. Mrs. Barry and Mrs. Rayburn will ensure the students are wearing the glasses properly and will limit their direct viewing for a brief moment, only seconds at a time.**
